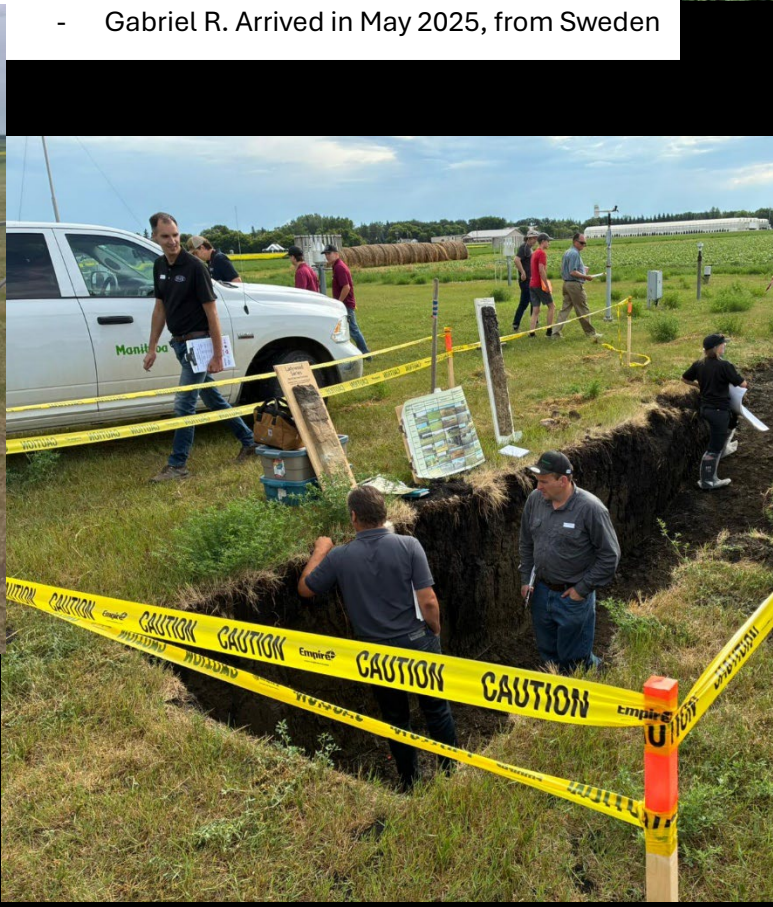




The most interesting thing was the canola varieties, and I could also see and understand more about the difference between black leg and verticillium disease.
